## **Career Opportunities**

As confirmed through follow-ups with our alumni, graduates of the MSc GUH programme are expected to take up positions related to management, policy, research or teaching in implementing agencies, NGOs or academic institutions at an international or national level.

All major health institutions and organisations that work in developmental and international cooperations (including the WHO, The Global Fund, World Bank, GAVI, UN-Habitat, UNICEF) typically require applicants to have a postgraduate Master degree in Global Health, Public Health, International Health or related areas. Likewise, urban and regional planners often need expertise in health and related issues.

You are eligible to apply if you have studied for at least **four years** at the University level in **any discipline**, have work experience in a relevant field for at least one year and a high level of English language proficiency (B2).

This modular course is held in English and it is a FULL TIME study (one academic year), with an initial phase in Freiburg (9 months) and the subsequent field study for the Master thesis which can be done abroad or as desk study in Freiburg.
